To access the page and view your child's assessment results, enter the unique six-digit passcode and date of birth from your most recent STAAR score report. The password must be entered exactly as it appears.

5. Enter your child's **first name only** and his or her **social security number in the SSN or S-Number Field**, and **birthdate**. Then click the blue **“Go”** button.
6. Your access code will appear in the code field with a message saying, “Access Code Lookup Successful”. Click the blue “Go” button again to see your child’s scores. Be sure to write down your access code for future use. The code is good for as long as your child is in a public school in Texas.
