

#### Academics

## **Chain of Command**

If you have a question or concern about your child, the classroom setting or a teacher concern, please set up a conference with the teacher. Teachers are available for conferences most days.

## Communication

Communication between the campus and parents comes in various ways. Teachers have their emails, Seesaw, notes home, and more. Be sure to learn how your child's teacher(s) communicates with parents. We also change our marquee regularly and send notices through School Messenger. Because there are so many activities going on at Dunaway, we ask that you regularly read all communication from teachers and administration.

### **Dress Code**

The student dress code is found on the WISD district web page. Our students, for the most part, dress very appropriately each day. Here are a few items to watch out for when sending your child to school.

- Tops no spaghetti straps and they must have backs. (No halters, no T-Backs, no crisscross backs)
- Shorts, skorts, skirts must be the length of the child's fingertips when held at their side.
- Fitted bottoms such as: leggings, leotards, yoga pants, or hosiery worn with only a blouse, sweater, or dress cannot be shorter than fingertip length with arms in normal
- position (i.e. arms hanging naturally as the student is standing straight and upright).
- For PE Tennis shoes are encouraged. Your child knows their PE schedule.
- No hair dyed any unnatural color (pinks, greens, blues, purples, etc.). No Mohawks or other disruptive hair styles.

#### Drop-Off and Dismissal Drop-Off

Each morning you may begin dropping off your students at 7:15 at the South side doors. Staff are on duty to supervise your children. It is advantageous for your child to be in the building by



7:55 each morning allowing him/her to be settled before the tardy bell rings at **8:05**. Thank you for your assistance in getting your student to school on time.

From 8:05 AM and later, an adult must walk them in the front of the building and sign them in. Please note our driveways run one way. The speed limit in our driveways is **10 mph**. Please adhere to the speed limit for the safety of our students. For the safety of all students, **please do not pass cars in the driveway**.

#### Dismissal

#### Kindergarten & First Grade and older siblings

Students are dismissed at 3:40. Parents are to enter the driveway from the south side of the building. Cars will line up along the curb. Please be aware that a small group of students will be dismissed at a different gate on the south side. Please do not block or hinder the bus driveway in the front of the school.

#### Second, Third, Fourth, & Fifth Grade

Students are dismissed at 3:40. Parents are to enter the driveway from the north side of the building. Cars will come down Sunnyside Dr., and line up along the curb. The line will continue down the Sunnyside Dr. curve (along our back fence). We line up in a one car line.

- For the safety of all students, **please do not pass cars in the driveway**.
- The driveway in front of the school is for school buses and daycare vehicles only from 7:15-8:00 am and 3:15-4:00 pm. Please do not park in front of the building during these times.

#### Walkers

Please do not pick a child in a car from the walking line. If you are in a car, please go through the pickup line. Cars will *not* be able to pick up walkers at the intersection next to our crossing guard. This is a safety hazard, and you will be redirected to the car pick up line.

### **Lost and Found**

Lost and Found items can be found in the cafeteria. It is a good idea to **put your child's name inside all their coats, jackets, and lunch boxes**. Then, if found we can return the item to them rather than placing it in the Lost and Found.



## Lunches (Breakfast, too)

The cafeteria food is excellent here at Dunaway. Our Food Service Department follows all nutritional requirements. Lunch is \$3.25. Breakfast is \$2.50. We would like everyone to fill out the online lunch application that will help you if your child qualifies for free or reduced lunch. If you qualify for free lunch, you will qualify for free breakfast at <u>My School Apps</u>. Of course, your child is also welcome to bring their lunch from home. **Note:** We do not have resources to "heat" lunches for your children. Please provide "ready to eat" lunches.



#### Eating with your child

Parents/grandparents are welcome to eat lunch with their child any day you so desire (except for state testing days in the spring). You must provide a photo ID and be on the student registration form to be allowed to do so. You may bring lunch in for your child or enjoy a cafeteria lunch with them. Adult meals are \$5.25. When you eat with your child it is a "date" between the two

of you, and you and your child will enjoy this special time on our stage. Friends of your child and/or neighbors are not allowed to join you. Parent and child only. Thank you.

#### **Perfect Attendance**

As mentioned previously, our goal is always to maintain a 98% attendance rate. It is the best way to ensure our students are learning – having them at school, in their seats, every day. We appreciate their presence by 7:55 AM, but students will be tardy at 8:05 AM. Students who are tardy miss valuable instructional time. If your child must leave early, please bring the office an excuse from the doctor or dentist if that is why the child is late or leaves early. We will be rewarding students with perfect attendance at the end of each semester and at the end of the academic year.

## **Specials**

Our children enjoy Art, Music, PE, and Technology each week. The teachers have innovative lessons that they teach every day. There are a few procedures that must be followed while in "Specials" classes.

- **Art** Mr. De La Cruz teaches many different art techniques each year. Some of these involve paint, clay and other materials that could be messy. Students should wear clothes on Art days that are easily washable.
- **Music** Mrs. Jones not only teaches music including vocal, recorders, drums and more, but she is the director of our programs each year. Every grade level presents an evening performance for parents and friends. Please watch for information on your child's performance and ensure they will be able to participate in the evening event.
- **PE** Coach Wells sees most students twice per week. Due to the nature of the PE activities, it is imperative that students wear tennis shoes every day they are in class. Students are aware of which days they go to PE.
- **Technology** Ms. Guajardo engages students in the computer lab with different activities including online programs, coding, and Google apps.

## Tardies

If a student arrives after 8:05 AM, an adult must walk them in front of the building and sign them in.

#### Toys, video games, or other expensive items

Unless specified for special days, these items are not allowed at school. We cannot be responsible if they are lost, stolen, or broken. Confiscated items may be returned only to parents. Cell phones and other electronic devices are not to be used during the instructional day. *However, in our current behavior system, some classes may bring electronic devices on specific reward days. You will receive a note from your child's teacher if they are allowed to bring one of these items.* Students in violation of these guidelines will have the item confiscated and only returned to the parent. Collectible items (including trading cards) are not allowed at school.

## Visitors

Parents are always welcome to visit the school to eat with their child or to attend events. A photo ID and your name on the registration card is required. If you wish to visit with a teacher, a conference needs to be set up in advance.

## Volunteers

Our active PTO is always looking for new members and parents to volunteer for events. You could assist with creating teacher bulletin board materials, make games for classrooms, help decorate the stage for PTO meetings, assist with all PTO committee activities. - 1. If there is a change in the way your child will be going home from school, please send a written note to the school with the student or call the front office. Communicating with the teacher only may cause confusion and delays in dismissal.
- 2. Reminder: Parents, it is against the law to talk on your phone in a school zone. Please refrain from doing so, as we do not want to see you ticketed on campus.
- 3. Parents may check out their child(ren) early from the office before 3:15 PM.
- 4. Please make emergency student transportation changes (for dismissal) prior to 2:30 PM.
