## Anonymous Campus Concerns:

- 1. How can we accommodate the number of students and the restrooms we have on campus?
  - A plan was discussed. Teachers present stated that they did not feel a schedule would alleviate the concerns. Classroom schedules can be looked at and adjustments can be made. Data can be collected to see were the main concerns.
- 2. Can we have Turner Townhouses placed back outside? On two separate occasions, Turner Town has been destructed. Houses flipped over and ripped apart. Playground items were discussed. Main concern is that our equipment is not being respected by the community who visit our playground after hours. Turner Town has been moved to the garden to prevent further vandalism. The houses are set in different areas to resemble a town. Several community members spent a Sunday afternoon repairing the houses, cleaning up the area, and painting a mural.
- 3. Do we have a plan for Turner's consistent growth? District is working on a plan to address the concern as a district.
- 4. The lack of an intercom system is a safety concern for students and staff. It is hard to hear over the current phone system. Can we have a school-wide intercom system? A plan is in place to get quotes and address the main areas of concerns.
